

INFORMATION LITERACY PROJECT #1: Initial Bibliography

You are to produce an initial bibliography in Chicago Style format on a topic that has something to do with witchcraft in the western world. This topic may be the one that you use for Presentation 4, or it may be something different. This bibliography is due in both electronic and paper form on Thursday, February 9. You should email me (bsspae@wm.edu) the electronic copy and bring the paper copy to class. Both are due by 3:30 p.m. Additional specifications are provided below.

Your bibliography should include at least 10 and no more than 15 sources, including:

- 3 scholarly articles
- 3 books in print format
- 1 primary source
- 1 Ph.D. dissertation or master's thesis
- 1 website
- 1 other non-traditional form of publication (podcast, video, etc.)

You should make use of the resources provided in the newly created W&M LibGuide on witchcraft to conduct bibliographical research:

For more information on Chicago Style, please see the following. Note that you will be using the notes/bibliography type of citation, favored by the humanities, rather than the author/date style favored by the sciences. Remember that automated bibliographic citation systems do not always produce the proper format. You need to check the format, and look up the necessary rules.

Criteria:

- **Basic Requirement (Pass/Fail grading)**
 - Bibliography is turned in on the day assigned, unless an acceptable excuse is presented.
- **Content (50%)**
 - Bibliography contains at least 10 and no more than 15 primary or secondary sources in the categories specified above.
- **Form (50%)**
 - Bibliography follows Chicago style format.
