

PRESENTATION 4



Give a digital presentation on a topic of your choosing related to the study of the witch in the Western world (8-10 min.: 25% of final grade). Your presentation must be argumentative, that is, you must set out to prove a thesis, rather than simply provide an overview of your topic. It must include both images and text.

In preparation for this presentation you will submit a formal **proposal** by Thursday, Mar. 16. The proposal will contain a statement of what you intend to cover in your presentation (your topic and thesis statement, i.e. what you are intending to prove about your topic) and an annotated bibliography on your topic (see separate handout on the annotated bibliography).

You will email to me by noon on Thursday, April 6, the **initial version** of your presentation, including your outline and Powerpoint. I will not grade this initial version, but I will give you feedback on it, as will the members of your presentation group.

You will **email to me by noon** on Monday, April 17, the **final version** of your presentation, including your digital presentation itself and a written summary containing a full outline of your presentation, two discussion questions for your audience, and a final bibliography (annotations not necessary, just the citations in Chicago style). You will also upload your presentation to the Blackboard discussion forum designated for this purpose by noon on that day. You will bring a hard copy of the written summary to class that day to turn in to me. You cannot change your summary or Powerpoint after this date.

After each in-class presentation, all students in the class, with the exception of the group of the person giving the presentation, will be required to write a **“One-Minute Paper,”** answering the following questions:

- What was the most important point in this presentation?
- What was the “muddiest” point in the presentation?
